

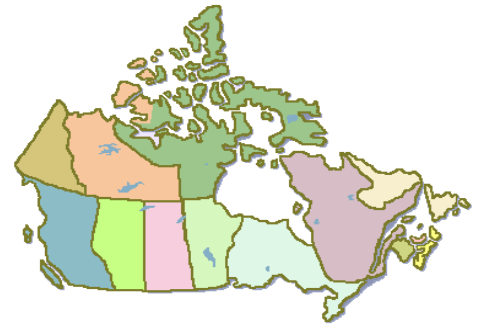

President's Message

PROTECTING THE CONSUMER

A couple of weeks ago, I was involved in a meeting with other section heads in our department during which the discussion turned to government regulation. The manager of one of our sites related an experience he had with a representative of a federal agency who reviewed, of all things, the descriptions of items offered on our menus. Apparently, if you have a 10 oz steak, the menu must say that is the uncooked weight. If you have eight chicken wings, you should get 8 drumsticks and 8 of the upper part. Otherwise, if you get just four of each totaling 8 pieces, you are only getting 4 wings. This all flows from regulations protecting the consumer against misleading labeling, both in restaurants and food stores.

That led me to a consideration of who protects the consumer of security services. We tend to look to the government for this protection but what we have across the country is not consistent. Such legislation and regulation is molded by its political masters and subject to the pressures of political lobbying. Professional standards are not born in this environment. As our colleagues in public policing all too often remind us, there is no national legislated standard of training for security personnel.

There is, however, a well crafted and thoughtful standard in existence that can be applied on a national level. This is the Canadian General Standards Board document entitled “Security Officers and Security Officer Supervisors” and is referenced as CAN/CGSB 133.1-2008. This is a living document, subject to review every five years, the most recent review just having been completed. Any discussion of the CGSB standard cannot go without a thank you to our Past President, Graham Ospreay, who led the review committee as its chair. I suspect that managing a large panel from all areas of the industry through a productive deliberation is a daunting task and he, and the members of the panel are to be congratulated on their work.

President's Message (continued)

While it can be argued that this is a procurement standard only, it provides useful guidance as to what our concerns should be and how they should be addressed. By aligning our training programs with this standard, we can assure Canadians that we are committed to the highest standards. Of course, the proof of this commitment is the requisite testing by a certification process, a process that CSIS provides through our certification programs.

These are two avenues we should commit to, to ensure the best service for Canadians across the country. It is of course voluntary, but it is the responsible course of action, and shows that we can be leaders in our industry without being forced to the trough by other pressures.

1. C.S.I.S. is part of the SIA (Security and Investigators Alliance) in Nova Scotia. Our goal is to work directly with government to affect the outcome of the pending legislative reform of the private guards and Investigators Act. SIA is planning a meeting of industry stakeholders with the date and location TBA soon. SIA members include, C.S.I.S. Inc., A.S.I.S., CPI-Atlantic, CANASA and the Corps of Commissionaires.

Recently in Dartmouth a retail employee reported to security personnel at Mic Mac Mall that she thought a customer fit the description circulated by Halifax Regional Police of persons involved in using illegal debit machines to steal banking information from unsuspecting clients. 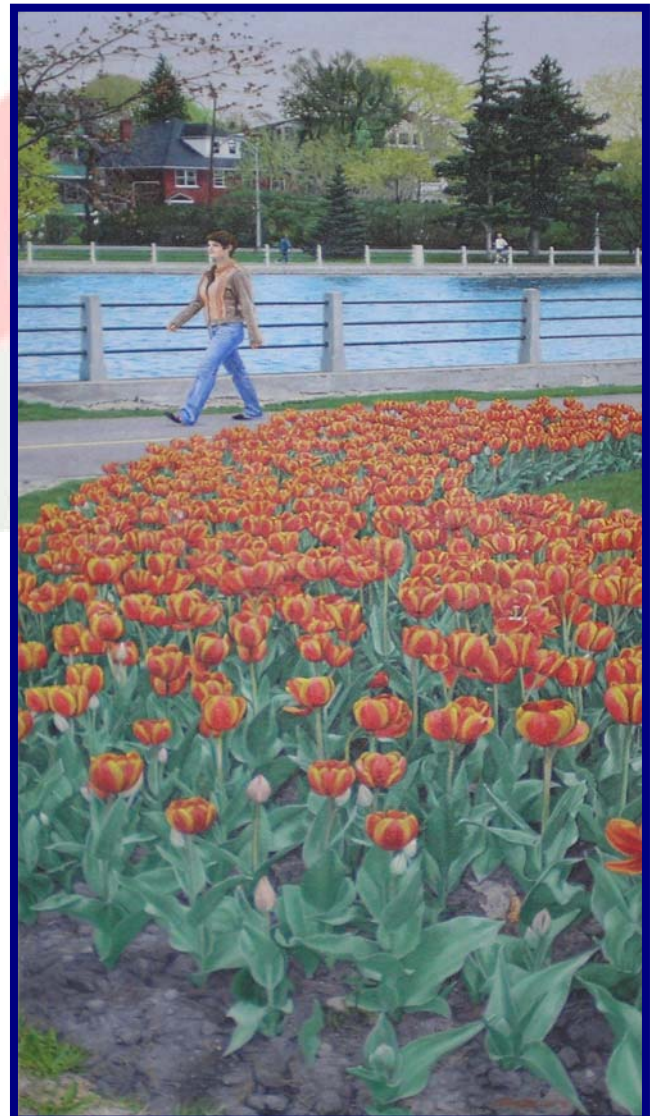
