THE VETERAN ON OUR TEN DOLLAR BILL

If you have a Canadian \$10 bill, look at the back right side of the bill. You will see an old veteran standing at attention near the Ottawa war memorial. His name is Robert Metcalfe and he just passed away at the age of 90.



That he managed to live to that age is rather remarkable, given what happened in the Second World War. Born in England, he was one of the 400,000 members of the British Expeditionary Force sent to the mainland where they found themselves facing the new German warfare technique - the Blitzkrieg.

He was treating a wounded comrade when he was hit in the legs by shrapnel. Enroute to hospital, his ambulance came under fire from a German tank, which then miraculously ceased fire. Evacuated from Dunkirk on HMS Grenade, two of the sister ships with them were sunk. Recovered, he was sent to allied campaigns in north Africa and Italy. Enroute his ship was chased by the German battleship Bismarck. In North Africa he served under General Montgomery against the Desert Fox, Rommel.

Sent into the Italian campaign, he met his future wife, a lieutenant and physiotherapist in a Canadian hospital. They were married in the morning by the mayor of the Italian town, and again in the afternoon by a British padre. After the war they settled in Chatham where he went into politics and became the warden (chairman) of the county. At the age of 80 he wrote a book about his experiences and on his retirement he and his wife moved to Ottawa. One day out of the blue he received a call from a government official asking him to go downtown for a photo op. He wasn't told what the photo was for or why they chose him.

"He had no idea he would be on the bill," his daughter said.

And now you know the rest of the story of the old veteran on the \$10 bill.

CSIS Inc Meeting Nov 8th 2007

SPEAKER: Vernon White, Chief of Police, Ottawa Police Service

OTTAWA – Vern White was sworn in as Chief of Police of the Ottawa Police Service by Ontario Regional Senior Justice Peter Griffiths on May 22, 2007.



Before heading the Ottawa Police Service, Chief White headed up the Durham Regional Police Service, a community of approximately 600,000 immediately east of Toronto. Prior to becoming Chief of Police in Durham in 2005, he spent over 20 years with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police; the last position he held was that of Assistant Commissioner for Information and Identification in Ottawa. Prior to that he worked in various policy and investigational areas in a number of locations including Halifax, the Yukon Territories, the Northwest Territories and Nunavut. His extensive experience includes major case management, community policing, proceeds of crime, Detachment/Unit Commander, support services management, commercial crime and program policy. He is proficient in both official languages.

Ottawa Chief-Designate White has a wealth of demonstrated successes in working with diverse communities, particularly Canada's First Nations and Inuit communities. "The Police Services Board is particularly impressed with Chief White's combination of strong operational and investigative experience, coupled with his outstanding track record in working with diverse communities and his skills in conflict resolution", said Board Chair Henry Jensen. He added, "The Board is delighted that Chief White has accepted the position and looks forward to working with him." Chief-Designate White takes office in May 2007.

In addition to a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Sociology and Psychology from Acadia University and a Diploma in Business Administration, Chief White holds a Masters Degree from Royal Roads University in British Columbia in Conflict Analysis and Management and completed his thesis on Restorative Justice.

Security Management Program: Through my eyes..**By Ben Wallace**

My name is Ben Wallace I am a second year student in the security management program at Algonquin College in the Police and Public Safety Institute. I speak to you today about my passion and my pursuit. I wish to elevate myself and my way of thinking to that of security professional. By definition, a Security professional is a worker required to possess a large body of knowledge derived from extensive academic study.

The Security Management program is a two-year intensive diploma program covering a wide variety of subjects from very basic physical security to advanced information technology security. Upon the completion of first year I realized just how little I knew. When I entered into the program, I had done Security guard and Loss prevention investigator work for some time...

My eyes were about to be opened, Just in first year I realized how vast and deep the ocean of security knowledge was and how little I actually knew. I am now going into my last term of this two-year adventure and I am struck by how much I still have left to learn. I attend CSIS Inc, ASIS, and FASO meetings and I network I become very humbled very quickly by meeting people much more experienced and wise than myself.

Up to this point I have learned about physical security, issues and trends in the field, the crucial role ethics plays in our chosen profession, how to write Security operating procedures, SMEAC tactical orders. How to conduct surveillance and counter surveillance, how the height of tree is the environment and sight lines can affect crime (or the perception of crime) I have learned the basics of management and leadership. How the law affects security professionals, but most of all, I have learned that I have a lot more to learn, through this, I approach the field, with an open mind like a sponge hoping to soak up knowledge of the generations, In order for a sponge to soak up water it must first be damp thus I have dampened my sponge of knowledge with the basics in this program and the water is what I learn outside of the classroom in the field, I for one look forward to it and embrace it with open arms.

This paper is not about me, it is about my passion. Security management program would not be what it is without its contingent of very talented and experienced professors its supporters, advisory board and field placement supervisors again I feel a great sense of gratitude for your sacrifices and contribution and I thank you. I feel very fortunate to have experienced their knowledge and perspective over this two year journey.

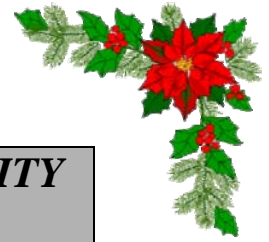
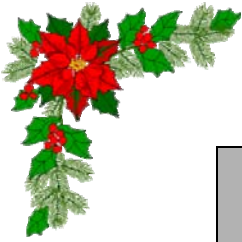
